CURRICULUM

The Buckley School maintains a rigorous college preparatory education grounded in collaboration, cultural competency, and character education. The school provides an intentionally small, supportive, and diverse learning environment.

Operating on a semester calendar, academic courses are yearlong. Students are expected to take a minimum of five academic courses and an additional sixth course each year.

Buckley is a member of One Schoolhouse, a consortium of independent schools through which students may enroll in online courses.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND HONORS COURSES

The Buckley curriculum includes 24 AP courses in addition to 12 honors courses in English, math, science, computer science, and world languages. Enrollment in AP courses is restricted to those who qualify through grades, completion of prerequisite courses, and departmental approval. Buckley restricts student enrollment to no more than two weighted courses per year in grade nine, no more than three weighted courses in grade 10, four weighted courses in grade 11, and five in grade 12. In rare instances, students may receive approval to enroll in more than the restricted allotment of weighted courses in each grade level.

GRADING SCALE AND GRADE POINT AVERAGE

A traditional grading system is used. The grade point average includes only courses taken at Buckley. Grades in AP and honors courses are weighted one point. Letter grades range from A to F with pluses and minuses. GPAs are cumulative and are calculated on a weighted 4.0 scale. **The mean** weighted GPA for the Class of 2024 is 3.98. The highest GPA in the class is 4.83. The Buckley School does not rank its students. The GPA is not listed on the Buckley transcript.

STANDARDIZED TEST SCORES

The school's goal is to decrease focus on standardized testing and reduce test anxiety by instructing students to wait until spring semester of their junior year to take official SAT and ACT exams. Our philosophy is that these exams, which are meant to be taken by second-semester juniors, should not be the focus of a student's education. Rather, the priority should be on engaging in the learning process and establishing an academic foundation that will serve students in college and beyond.

DISCIPLINARY REPORTING POLICY

The Buckley School will respond to direct inquiries from colleges or other academic institutions of any notable changes in a student's academic or personal status, including, but not limited to, a significant drop in grades, course changes, suspension, disciplinary probation, dismissal, and extended absences from school. When such information is requested, the student will be advised to address their transgression in a separate letter to the colleges or other academic institutions.

THE BUCKLEY SCHOOL'S RESPONSE TO COVID-19

The Buckley School commenced remote learning in March 2020 with the intention of returning to campus after a few weeks. However, in response to the progression of the COVID-19 pandemic and state and local safer-at-home orders, Buckley's Upper School remained closed through April 2021 when it reopened in a hybrid model.

In anticipation of a possible move to remote learning, Buckley began preparing in the weeks leading up to the campus closure. Buckley's information technology team collaborated closely with our faculty and our families to ensure a seamless transition to remote learning so that instruction for all courses could be conducted via Zoom. Our faculty rose to the occasion and many of our teachers used it as an opportunity to create innovative instructional methods, which continued to keep Buckley's students engaged and productive. Course offerings remained varied and robust with a full selection of honors and AP courses. Because disruptions were minimized as much as possible, Buckley continued to award letter grades. As was the case at schools across the country, sports and on-campus extra-curricular activities and events were suspended and off-campus opportunities were limited.

Buckley has been back in session, in person and on campus, fulltime since the Fall of 2021.
